




# <u>Clues in Revelation</u>








# The Hour of Destruction





# The Hour of Destruction

- Rev. 9:15, "So the four angels, who had been prepared for the hour, the day, the month, and the year, were released to kill a third of mankind." This is a pre-determined day that God has already established. This is the 6th trumpet, also called the 2nd Woe. The numbered of the mounted troops was two hundred million. ESV




# God Wants us to Know



# harpazō (ἁρττάζω) MYTH 1: Many have been taught that the rapture, the harpazō, was a secret quiet nobody knows about this, catching away of believers. Many perceive this rapture is a secret thing nobody knows the day or the hour and the rapture is going to take people by surprise like a thief in the night and that the rapture is quiet and sudden. It can be, but the verb harpazō can be a surprise, but it is sudden and quick; not quietly nor in secret




- harpazō can be a surprise, but it is sudden (not done in secret) and quick (timing) action!
  - John 10:12, "But a [a]hireling, he who is not the shepherd, one who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf <u>catches</u> the sheep and scatters them." NKJV
  - Acts 23:10, "Now when there arose a great dissension, the commander, fearing lest Paul might be pulled to pieces by them, commanded the soldiers to go down and take him by force from among them, and bring him into the barracks." NKJV






# parousía(mapoudiac) 1. The Coming of the Lord parousía (mapoudiac) Strong's 3952: coming (22x), presence (2x) A presence, a coming (used in reference to the Lord) parousía (from parōn, "be present, arrive to enter into a situation") - properly, coming, especially the arrival of the owner who alone can deal with a situation (cf. LS). parousía is a "technical term with reference to the visit of a king or some other official, 'a royal visit' " (Souter) 'harpazō' is about believers going up. 'parousía' is about Christ coming down.



#### parousía (παρουσίας) <u>2. The Day of the Lord, 3. A Thief in the Night</u>


- 1Thessalonians 5: 2, "for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night."
- Revelation 16: 15, "Look, I come like a thief! Blessed is the one who stays awake and remains clothed, so as not to go naked and be shamefully exposed."
- 2 Peter 3: 10, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed."

Matthew 24: 29, "Immediately after the distress of those days, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light; the stars will fall from the sky, and the heavenly bodies will be shaken. Then will appear the sign of the Son of Man in heaven. And then all the peoples of the earth will mourn when they see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven, with power and great glory."



## parousía (παρουσίας) – 7. Millennium

- 2 Peter 3:3, "you must understand that in the last days scoffers will come, scoffing and following their own evil desires. Where is this 'coming' he promised? Ever since our ancestors died, everything goes on as it has since the beginning of creation."
  - **v 8**, "But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord <u>one day is as a thousand years</u>, and **a thousand years as one day**."
- v 10, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.[a]"
